#3 Crusaders Hoops Take Over in Second Half to Stay Unbeaten

February 9 – Oradell, NJ – The Ramapo Raiders travelled to Bergen Catholic to take on the unbeaten Crusaders. Former Crusader player and current Ramapo High School Head Coach, Joe Sandberg, knew exactly the type of battle his team was in for and they tried to match the talent of Bergen Catholic with grit and hustle early.



Ramapo came out showing they knew they were going to have to win this battle on the defensive end. The Raiders were converging on the Bergen Catholic big guys, forcing guards to beat them off the dribble through traffic, and making it tough to finish shots at the rim. Bergen Catholic matched Ramapo's intensity, pressing early and making it difficult for their guards to

settle in. Ramapo's point guard did a great job early of setting the tempo and controlling the offense despite the pressure being applied by Bergen Catholic's defense.



Bergen did a great job defending in the paint, but Ramapo was finding success on the drive and kick for the perimeter shot. Despite their early struggles on offense Bergen put together a few solid sequences with Will Richardson showing a great ability to finish at the rim through traffic. To the surprise of many Ramapo lead after the first, but the Bergen Catholic offense was just getting started.

A tough defensive struggle in the first quarter turned into a bit of a track meet to start the second. Both teams were out of control in transition and it was Bergen Catholic's freshman guard Elliot Cadeau, and team leader Julian Brown who settled things down. Cadeau was excellent in one-on-one situations, creating separation and finding his own shot whenever he wanted it. He answered a couple of Ramapo shots with threes of his own to keep the Crusaders within striking distance.



The back court of Cadeau, Brown and Richardson never stopped attacking the basket, and it got Bergen Catholic into the bonus with 5:39 still to go in the second quarter. Joe Scrivanich came off the bench and provided the Crusaders with a much-needed spark of energy as well, playing intense on ball defense and scoring a couple of much needed baskets. The energy was where it needed to be and the Crusader offense had finally got going, with a halftime score of 31-31, it felt like Bergen Catholic took Ramapo's best shot and was ready to finish the job.

The Crusaders came out in the second half and never looked back, getting strong efforts up and down the lineup. Elliot Cadeau showed the ability to finish both inside and out, playing excellent in transition, and controlling to second half of the game.

Freshman Terry Copeland provided the Crusaders with 8 points and a couple of mean blocks, one that lead Will Richardson out in transition for a huge dunk, stealing all the momentum.

DiAri Duncan, Terry Copeland, and Elijah Flournoy held down the paint in the second half, doing an incredible job of protecting the rim. Several huge blocks on the defensive end led to scores in transition for Julian Brown, and at this point Bergen Catholic was in full control. Brown scored a team high 19 points and was a leader on the defensive end all night long.

Tenacious defense leading to transition offense was the story of the third quarter and the Crusaders outscored Ramapo 25-10, completely taking control of the game.

DiAri Duncan had a big finish to the fourth quarter helping close out the game for good.

While the BC's offense will impress on most nights, it was the effort on the defensive end that stood out in this one. The type of effort that could stifle an offense on any given day.



Ramapo gave the Crusaders their best shot, but their best was not enough on this night as BC continues to show why it is one of the best and most well-rounded teams in the state.

The Crusaders entered the game ranked #3 in New Jersey coming off statement wins against Don Bosco Prep and Ridge HS and were looking at




the prospects of no game this week until the Morris County squad stepped up.

Bergen Catholic started hot in the first quarter, playing aggressively on the offensive and defensive side, taking the Celtics by surprise ending the quarter 17-11 Crusaders.

A shaky second quarter for both teams offensively, with miscommunications and plenty of turnovers, ended the half with 31-28 Crusaders.

Carmelo Velardo interviewed Crusader's coach, Billy Armstrong and asks him what the keys are to winning this game in the second half. Coach Armstrong responded, "The key of this second half is to not turn over the ball." He went on to say, "The team is effectively splitting the opposing guards, but they are dribbling those one or two extra dribbles instead of passing out to the guards and scoring. We want to get a shot up at least once every possession."

Going into the second half both teams were ready to play and going at it. The Patrick School started with a hot start in the beginning of the third quarter, but were quickly cooled down by Julian Brown's exciting offense, firing up Bergen and putting out the Celtics.

With both teams fired up in a nail biting back-and-forth fourth quarter, the Crusaders pulled away and came out on top.

After the game BCTV's Carmelo Velardo interviewed Julian Brown, the player of the game. Julian said, "This was an energized win, we came out here to win, not worrying about the other

team. I just came and played regularly, playing my hardest."


Pierces Lancer Defenses

Learning the Hard Lessons of Slalom Skiing

Bird of the Week: Horned

Lark

February 13 – Alpha, NJ – I know, I know... Where on earth is Alpha, NJ and what is a horned lark?

Alpha is in Warren County, just south of Route 78 at Exit 3. It is rural and space where corn fields abound, though snow covered at this time of year. It doesn't stop them from inhabiting the spacious fields.

You can generally find these "dirt colored" birds popping around on farmlands all year round. During non-snow-covered-field times of year, these birds become visible especially when they turn their heads toward you and allow you to see a bright yellow face with "horns" that seem to extend above their ears.
