Iron Rusts in the Wake of the Crusader Swimmers

March 15 – Ridgewood, NJ – On the second straight day, BC swam in a very competitive meet, this time taking down Don Bosco Prep 95-75 at the Ridgewood YMCA.



The Crusaders, relied on its considerable depth as the they placed first in only 5 of 11 events. Led by Doyee Kim, Alex Vester and Tom Haemmerle and winning the final event, the 400 Free Relay with Gavin Perez, Alex Vester, Haemmerle and Sam Hughes BC improved to 4-0 on the young season.



The freshman, Doyee Kim, made the most news on the day, winning two races, the 50 Free (23.21)

and 100 Free (57.07). His 50-yard sprint set a new season best for the Crusaders.

Senior Alex Vester set a new team season best in the 100 Butterfly with a solid swim (57.07) and classmate Tom Haemmerle beat his 500 Free time this season by over six seconds with a 5:03.16. Perez, Vester, Haemmerle and Hughes finished off the meet with a season best 3:36.07 in the 400 Free Relay to finish the afternoon.

Three Crusaders Named All-North Jersey. Hoops

March 15 – Paterson, NJ - -Three members of North Jersey's #1 Basketball Team were named to the All-North Jersey Teams. Without much surprise, it is all three heads of their "three-headed-dragon" back court. Unfortunately for BC, a shortened season impacted their individual statistics, but anyone who was able to see this triad, couldn't help but be impressed.

Junior Will Richardson (G) – 1st **Team –** Richardson returns as a first teamer. He led the 7-2 Crusaders in FGs (41), 3PT (20), PTS (164), PPG (18.2), and FT% (.880). Will is just 331 points away from 1,000 in his career, resting at 669.



Junior Julian Brown (G) -2^{nd} Team - A twoyear starter, Julian had terrific junior year, displaying his effectiveness as a scorer. He was the team's second leading scorer with 132 points and 14.7 per game. Julian's 34 Free Throw Attempts and 28 made, were tops on the team. knocked down



.824 of those. Julian has 575 career points and within range or hitting the 1,000-point mark in his senior year as well.

Freshman Elliot Cadeau (G) – 3rd Team – Cadeau tied with Brown for the second most 2pt field goals on the team with Brown (31). His 11 threes were third on the team and the outstanding freshman scored 104 points, third on the team, good for 11.6 points per game.

Two Crusaders, Christopher Bacaglioni and Dominick Brogna, won by decision. Both were in dramatic fashion as their bouts went to overtime.

High School Wrestling Matches have 14 bouts which cover various light, middle and heavyweight categories. Team scoring for each bout is as follows: 6 points for a PIN, FORFEIT or DEFAULT BY INJURY OR PENALTY.
5 points for a TECHNICAL FALL (win by more than 15 points), 4 points for a MAJOR DECISION (win by more than 8 points), 3 points for a DECISION (win by 7 points or less).

Shane Griffith '18 Wins NCAA National Championship and OUTSTANDING WRESTLER

March 18 - St. Louis, Mo - Shane Griffith, Bergen



Catholic Class of 2018, became Stanford's first National Champion wrestler, in the over 100-year history of the program. This year is scheduled to be its final year

as well, making Griffith's accomplishment all the more special.

Shane was named outstanding wrestler of the tournament. As the 8-seed at 165 pounds, Shane defeated the #25 and #9 seeds before running into the top (#1) seed from Iowa in the quarterfinal round. Shane defeated him in sudden victory overtime, 3-1.

At that point, Shane dominated his final two opponents, the #5 seed from Bucknell in the semifinal (9-2) and the #3 seed from Pittsburgh

(6-2) in the final.

Griffith won three NJSIAA State Championships as a BC student-athlete. He and Nick Suriano are the first two Bergen alumni to win national titles.



Griffith's accomplishment is all-the-more-remarkable as it comes following Stanford's announcement to drop their wrestling program. While the fate of the program remains in doubt, Shane and his teammates created awareness, wearing black singlets without the school's logo throughout the tournament.

In an interview following his final bout, Shane commended his coach, recognizing all he did to make 2021 a reality. It was a season much in doubt before the academic year began.



Bird of the Week: Great Horned Owl



A FUNNY THING HAPPENED TO ME...

March 19 - Undisclosed Location - Actually, I need to back this up to our faculty-in-service day on March 12^{th} as I brought up in a large group, virtual setting, my love of birding.

I may have, tongue-in-cheek, said to the group and facilitator that I was coming out as a birder for the first time to our faculty and staff. Of course, our BC family knew I was kidding, but one of our members one-upped me as she said how offended she was that I didn't remember telling her about my hobby.

First opportunity I had, I made my way to speak with her to apologize and she confided she was kidding me. We spoke for a few minutes and

she mentioned she sees an owl every day, in a tree near her house.

I had to ask. "WHERE DO YOU LIVE????" Owls are not easy to find. You generally see them when someone points one out to you. And you generally never tell anyone where you found an owl as owls should never be disturbed during the day. It is one of the reasons they are so well camouflaged.

Owls are night hunters and they need to be well-rested so they can be effective hunters. Tired hunters are poor hunters. Poor hunters starve to death. Often you may see an owl because birds are trying to harass it during the day to prevent it from sleeping. Birds know!

For this reason, birders never tell anyone who does not understand this principle where they find an owl, if they tell anyone at all. If you see an owl, please do not disturb it. Let him/her hunt all the mice, moles and rodents it wants. They really do us a great service.

For me, it was a remarkable week for owls. We encountered an Eastern Screech Owl on Tuesday and a Great Horned Owl in Bergen County on Friday and another in Sullivan County, NY on Saturday. It is likely the pictured owl's mate is sitting on eggs at this time. A number of raptors in the area are breeding now so their young are ready for when the breeding cycle finishes for other species, they are primed to pounce.
